- Conducted the first systematic review on the sale and advertisement of illicit drugs on social media, by reviewing 4000+ studies and extracting and analysing data on machine learning models, users, drugs, rate of posts, terminology and study methodology.

- Selected by Ofcom's Online Harm Supervision Team to provide expertise and intelligence to Ofcom's Consultation on Illegal Harms as part of the **Online Safety Act Regulatory Regime** (February 2024)

Project 2: Seeing, buying and reporting drugs on social media: A National Survey

- Designed and conducted the first large scale national survey of UK school students on their experiences and attitudes on illicit drug advertisements and content on social media platforms
- Collaborated and coordinated with the Daniel Spargo-Mabbs Foundation (DSMF) and the Alcohol Education Trust (AET) to disseminate the survey to a network of schools expecting 5000+ answers across England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland.
- Created a between subjects-experiment within the survey to test and compare the effectiveness of messaging to increase user reporting of illicit drug content, with the objective of testing messages in real-time user interfaces.
